Applicants must be residents of DuPage County for at least 90 days; be between the ages of 19 and 64; have a household income at or below 200 percent of Federal Poverty Level and be ineligible for other health insurance programs (Medicaid, Medicare, etc.)

The staff, consisting of public health nurses, dental hygienists, nutritionists, and health educators, provides individual consultation, screening, clinic services and educational programs to county residents. Services of interest to senior citizens include:

- ◆ **Immunization Clinics** – flu clinics held in the fall to protect the elderly from the influenza virus. Consult your local newspaper for schedules and locations, or check the DuPage County Health Department website listed above.

- ◆ **Dental Clinic** - for income eligible and uninsured clients with urgent oral problems such as pain, bleeding, infection and/or swelling.
- ◆ **TB Clinic** - at the central office in Wheaton for tuberculosis testing, follow-up and treatment.
- ◆ **Travel Clinic** - offers vaccinations for those traveling outside of the USA.
- ◆ **Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening** - free screening for eligible, uninsured women age 35 and older; referrals, case management services and community education programs.

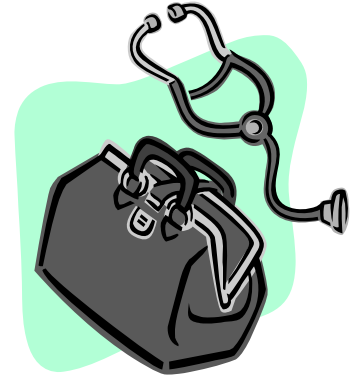
