## WHAT IS EARLY VOTING?

Developed in response to the Federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA), Early voting gives qualified voters the opportunity to cast their ballot during an allotted time period prior to Election Day.

This ballot is cast by personal appearance at the DuPage County Election Commission office or at locations in DuPage County established by the Election Commission.

## WHO CAN EARLY VOTE?

Any DuPage County qualified voter may early vote at any DuPage County Early Voting site located throughout the County. An early voter is not required to state a reason for voting early.

## CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE? WHAT IS “GRACE PERIOD” REGISTRATION?

“Grace Period” Registration is an extension of the period of time for a voter to register to vote, or to update their registration information. This time period extends registration from the normal close of registration through the day before Election Day. Once registered, this voter may cast a ballot at the Election Commission office.

## WHY SHOULD I VOTE EARLY?

A major reason for early voting is to encourage greater participation in the election and avoid long lines. People who travel for business, work long hours or are otherwise inconvenienced by the hours the polls are open may find it easier to vote early.

## WHEN CAN I EARLY VOTE?

The period for Early Voting begins March 10th and extends through March 18th, at the DuPage County Election Commission office, March 20th through April 3rd at permanent Early Voting locations, and March 20th through April 1st at Temporary Early Voting locations.

## WHERE CAN I VOTE?

In addition to its office, the DuPage County Election Commission offers ten Early Voting locations throughout DuPage County, including municipal, township and park district offices.

The Election Commission has also established Early Voting sites in several local shopping malls.

### DUPAGE COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION

The DuPage County Election Commission is an independent, bi-partisan government entity operating under state and federal election laws to promote accurate, efficient, accessible and secure elections in DuPage County. We serve the public through education and information about the election process, voter registration, election administration and leadership in improving election procedures. We maintain the highest professional standards to ensure the integrity of the election process.

## IS EARLY VOTING THE SAME AS VOTE BY MAIL?

Effective August 17, 2009, a qualified voter may request and vote a Vote by Mail ballot without stating a reason. Vote by Mail voting may be done either “by mail” or “in person” beginning March 10th through March 30, 2017.

Under Early Voting, anyone who is an eligible voter may cast a ballot during the Early Voting period, for whatever reason, by visiting a designated Early Voting site and showing a valid government issued photo identification.

## IF I VOTE EARLY BUT CHANGE MY MIND, MAY I VOTE ON ELECTION DAY?

No. The law prohibits a person who voted during the Early Voting period from voting again on Election Day. Once an early vote has been cast, the vote is final.

## IS ELECTIONEERING ALLOWED?

No. Electioneering is prohibited at the Early Voting site and a campaign-free zone will be established like it is at the polling place on Election Day.

## ARE POLLWATCHERS ALLOWED?

Yes. Like at the regular polling place on Election Day, pollwatchers may be appointed to observe Early Voting by personal appearance at each permanent and temporary polling place where Early Voting is conducted,
